English Activity

Today you could write and perform a poem for your family.

There are many different types of poetry; one of these is rhyming poetry.

Rhyming Poetry:

Many poems have rhyme within them. Sometimes the rhyme is internal (middle) where the rhyme occurs within one single line of a verse. On other occasions, the rhyme occurs at the end of a line. Commonly, the ends of the first and third-line rhyme and the ends of the second- and fourth-line rhyme.

An Example of an ABAB Rhyming Poem

At the top of a large, bushy **tree** **A**

Sat a bird with a broken **wing** **B**

He was trapped and could not break **free** **A**

And so all day, he did nothing but **sing.** **B**

Plan your poem before writing it. Think of your theme, any interesting information about your theme that you want to include and finally a list of rhyming pairs that you could include. When you are ready, you can begin to write your poem. Each verse will have four lines, and follow the ABAB rhyming pattern as in the example above. Try to write a poem with at least two verses, you can write as many verses as you like.

When you have finished the poem, perform it to your family. Good Luck.
