



## INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

1. The name of the school is Childwall Church of England Primary School.
2. The school is a Voluntary Aided school.
3. The name of the governing body is "The Governing Body of Childwall Church of England Primary School".
4. The Governing Body shall consist of:
  - a. Two parent Governors
  - b. One Local Authority Governor
  - c. One staff Governor
  - d. One Headteacher
  - e. Eight foundation Governors
  - f. One co-opted Governor
5. Total number of Governors shall be fourteen.
6. The term of office of all categories of Governors, with the exception of Headteacher and Ex-Officio, is four years.
7. Those entitled to appoint Foundation Governors are:
  - a. The Trustees of Salisbury House who shall appoint three Foundation Governors
  - b. The Liverpool Diocesan Board of Education who shall appoint the Bishops Nominee and three Foundation Governors in consultation with the Trustees of Salisbury House
8. The holder of the following office shall be a Foundation Governor Ex-officio:
  - a. The Vicar of All Saints Church, Childwall
  - b. The Archdeacon of Liverpool shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the Ex-officio Foundation Governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that Ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21(1) of the Regulations.

9. The Bishop of the Diocese of Liverpool shall be entitled to request the removal of his Ex-officio Foundation Governor and appoint a substitute Governor.
10. Salisbury House Trust are the owners of the land on which the school is sited.
11. Recognising its historic foundation the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the doctrines of the Church of England at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing education of the highest quality within the context of Christian beliefs and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers all its pupils.

12. This Instrument of Government comes into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015.
13. This instrument was made by order of Liverpool Local Authority on 10<sup>th</sup> August 2015.
14. This Instrument of Government was approved by the Diocese of Liverpool on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2015.
15. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governor body (and the Headteacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
