British Values and Mathematics at Childwall CE Primary School

At Childwall all of our pupils are encouraged to achieve their maximum potential through maths lessons and learn the importance of maths in all aspects of life. Children of all abilities are encouraged to believe they can achieve and this builds confidence and self-esteem.

Individual Liberty: This is promoted by giving the children opportunities to discuss their viewpoints whilst being respectful of others.

Mutual Respect: Group work encourages the children to work as part of a team and helps them understand that we can all solve problems in different ways. This promotes the British values of mutual respect and support for one another.

Tolerance: Whilst carrying out investigations and applying maths to a range of situations, tolerance, patience and resilience are promoted as children are encouraged to persevere, take risks and try different methods.

Democracy and Rules of the Law: Children are involved in democratic voting through 'Votes for School' programme in which the children have weekly classroom debates.

Children learn that maths comes from a range of different cultures. Celebrating events such as Pi Day and studying Pythagoras helps the children understand that maths originates from different cultures.
