

#### **EYFS**

This week, our learning continued to be inspired by the story of 'Percy the Park Keeper - After the Storm' by Nick Butterworth. We enjoyed working together to sequence the events of the story to create a story map and then we used this to help us to retell the story using our own words. We also continued to use our phonic knowledge to help us decode CVC words from the story - our teachers were very impressed!

Within our story this week, we also discussed how Percy the Park Keeper worked hard to help others to rebuild their homes after the storm. This inspired us to think about other members of our community that can help us, including the police, ambulance service, firefighters, nurses, doctors and the grown-ups who help us to learn in school. As well as thinking about the different ways people can help us in our community, we also compared these jobs in the past and present, exploring the similarities and differences with their uniforms, modes of transport and workplaces. Amongst all of this wonderful learning, we have been working hard to rehearse for our Nativity that we are very excited to perform for our grown-ups next week!



On Tuesday, our Year 2s set off on a long, magical journey (to Garston, then Bethlehem), discovering who the mysterious 'Rescuer' was. Josh and Ruth explained the true meaning of the Christmas story and we had a wonderful time together as we learned that God gave us the best gift ever - his son! Thank you to all at Bridge Chapel for another wonderful visit - it really is a highlight of our school calendar.



## Year 3 - Therapy Dog

Year 3 were thrilled to meet Tilly and Mrs Miles on Monday; Mrs Miles couldn't believe how calm we all were and how much Tilly loved everyone. We discovered that Tilly's best friend is a cat called Felix, she loves sausages and Tilly is 6 years old. We'll keep you posted as we begin our reading journey with her.



















In Year 4 this week we have been thinking about the importance of looking after our teeth. We learnt about the different teeth we have and the different jobs each of them does. We discussed things that are harmful to teeth and things that may stain our teeth if we don't brush them properly. Next, we set up an experiment using eggs and different liquids. Over the week, we are going to monitor the changes in the eggs and see which liquid stains the eggs the most. It has also been computing week in Year 4 and we have been using the animation tool "2 animate" in order to make our own animations. We learnt about "frames" and how many frames per second it takes to make certain animations. You can check out some of our work on in our work folders within purple mash.



Year 5 have worked really hard in our English curriculum this week, further developing their grammatical understanding and widening their range of spelling strategies. We were also met with an advent surprise on Friday morning with the arrival of our own class elves accompanied with gold chocolate 'treat' coins! The children are also really looking forward to welcoming their families to our gathering on Monday morning! They have been practising lots of singing and poetry and cannot wait to perform!
