Year 3 Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.
Year 4 Recall multiplication and division facts for all multiplication tables up to 12 x 12.
Year 5 & 6 Revision of all times tables and division facts up to 12 x 12.

A reflection from Ms Malone

As we journey towards Christmas, our school value of **Hope** has been on my mind in a very personal way. Having a sixteen-year-old daughter myself, I'm often reminded that hope is something we grow alongside our children — through every stage, challenge, and milestone. As parents, watching our children face the world with increasing independence encourages us to place our trust in God's plans, even when the path ahead feels uncertain or busy.

The lead-up to Christmas brings its own mixture of excitement, reflection, and sometimes a little overwhelm, but it also offers a beautiful reminder of the hope God gives us through the birth of Jesus. Isaiah 40:31 tells us, *"Those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."* I find such comfort in that promise — that even in the rush of school life, parenting, and preparing for the season, God meets us with renewed strength and gentle reassurance.

In this weeks lunchtime sessions, our focus was on micro-moments, small things, big feelings.



I explained to the children that a micro-moment is a tiny thing you can do or you can notice that can make you or someone else feel safe, calm or happy.

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Agents for Change & Worship Ambassadors - Charity Reverse Advent Calendar

This year, the Agents for Change & Worship Ambassadors are delighted to be running a charity initiative 'Reverse Advent Calendar' over advent to raise donations for **South Liverpool Food Bank**.

What Is a Reverse Advent Calendar?

Instead of *receiving* something each day of Advent, each class will have a designated day to *give* one type of donation that will then be given to our local food bank - **each school day in December will become a "day of giving"** rather than a day of getting.

What should I donate and when?

Please see the list of dates below to find out when your child's class donation day is as well as suggested items to donate, if you are able.

Monday 1st December – Class RG

Tinned Food – “A can of kindness to begin Advent!”  

Examples: Tinned soup, beans, vegetables, tinned tomatoes, tinned fruit, tinned pasta.

Tuesday 2nd December – Class RO

Cereal & Breakfast Items – “Helping someone start their day with a smile!”   

Examples: Cereal boxes, porridge oats, cereal bars, instant oats, breakfast biscuits.

Wednesday 3rd December – Class 1B

Biscuits & Snacks – “A sweet surprise for someone special!”   

Examples: Biscuits, crackers, cereal bars, snack packs, flapjacks.

Thursday 4th December – Class 1G

Toiletries – “Sharing comfort and care this season!”   

Examples: Toothpaste, toothbrushes, toilet roll, soap, shampoo, shower gel, deodorant.

Friday 5th December – Class 2M

Tinned Food – “Warm hearts with a hearty donation!”    

Examples: Tinned meals, soup, beans, fish, vegetables, fruit.

Monday 8th December – Class 2C

Chocolate Treats – “A little chocolate cheer to brighten the day!”   

Examples: Chocolate bars, selection boxes, hot chocolate sachets, chocolate coins.

Tuesday 9th December – Class 3K

Savoury Snacks – “A tasty token of kindness!”   

Examples: Crisps, pretzels, crackers, popcorn (sealed packets).

Wednesday 10th December – Class 3J

Tinned Food – “Nourishment wrapped in kindness!”   

Examples: Tinned soup, vegetables, pulses, meat, fruit, pasta meals.

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Thursday 11th December – Class 4K



Chocolate Treats – “Sharing a moment of sweet joy!”

Examples: Chocolate bars, sharing bags, festive chocolates, hot chocolate mix.

Friday 12th December – Class 4F



Pet Supplies – “A helping paw for furry friends!”

Examples: Dog food, cat food, treats, pouches, tins.

Monday 15th December – Class 5D



Toiletries – “Everyday essentials that make a big difference!”

Examples: Shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, soap, wipes, toilet roll, deodorant.

Tuesday 16th December – Class 5K



Baby Items – “Gentle gifts for growing little ones!”

Examples: Baby wipes, nappies, baby lotion, baby snacks, baby toiletries.

Wednesday 17th December – Class 6M



Household Essentials – “Practical help for home and heart!”

Examples: Washing-up liquid, sponges, cloths, laundry detergent, bin bags.

Thursday 18th December – Class 6RP



Chocolate Treats – “A festive chocolate boost to brighten spirits!”

Examples: Chocolate bars, truffles, festive chocolates, sharing bags, hot chocolate sachets.
